We are writing to express our support for **Senate Bill 619**, in-person early voting.

As our colleagues at the RI Coalition for the Homeless have noted, this bill will provide expanded access for homeless voters. Many very low-income individuals juggle difficult schedules and face significant barriers to transportation access. This bill, if enacted, allows an in-person voting experience for these individuals and for others who may have access or mobility challenges that make it difficult to get to the polls during the designated hours on election day. An expansion of early voting allows individuals more flexibility to fit voting into their lives conveniently and easily.
